The Chamber of Minerals and Energy of Western Australia (CME) is the peak resources sector representative body in Western Australia.


- Over 200 member companies representing 95 per cent of the state's resources production by value

Goldfields-Esperance Region: Snapshot



Resource Sector Contribution 2017/18:

- Over \$250m of wages paid to direct employees
- Over \$610m paid directly into the region
- o 713 business directly supported
- Total direct contribution into the region is over <u>\$1.3bn</u>



'Baseline' operational workforces are forecast to moderate across the forward decade

However this does not account for the recent uptick in construction activity across the sector (incl. iron ore, battery materials and gold)

Competition for skills will continue to tighten; and WA is competing with major governmentfund infrastructure projects on the east coast

How is a DAMA established?




DAR submitted a business case for a DAMA



Minister for Immigration, Citizenship and Multicultural Affairs agreed to enter into negotiation with the DAR for a DAMA.

Terms and concessions negotiated by DAR and the Minister's delegate (Department of Home Affairs)




DAMA signed by both parties and is executed.



DAMA Labour Agreement Template is created and employers in the region can apply to be endorsed by the DAR.

Goldfields DAMA Update



Since the announcements, we received over 300 queries

- Individual queries (130+) Australia, Argentina, Brazil, Dubai, France, India, Iran, Ireland,
 Italy, Nigeria, South Africa, South Korea, Zambia and Zimbabwe
- Migration agents (90)
- Businesses (40+)
- Other (LG, State Government Departments)

We received 4 endorsement applications since July 2019 for occupations such as Child Care Workers, Hotel/Motel Managers, and Metal Machinist (Boiler Maker).

Around 80 people attended the 1st Goldfields DAMA information session – April 2019

Around 50 people attended the 2nd Goldfields DAMA information session & website launch – June 2019


