

## **Rough Sleeper Count**

**March 2020** 

### A need in WA

- The City of Perth conducted a count of people sleeping rough within its boundaries in March 2020.
- Street counts provide a point-in-time count of the number of people in a location who are observed to be rough sleeping.
- This was essential for WA and the City of Perth as data had not been collected since Census and Registry Week in 2016.
- Anecdotal information from service providers varied from 400-1200 people per night.



### City of Sydney

- A street count has been used in the City of Sydney since 2008.
- The City of Sydney conducts counts twice a year in February and August (summer and winter).
- The City of Sydney provided consultation and assistance with planning of the count in Perth.




### Methodology

The City of Perth's Information, **Communication Technology (ICT) Services** team alongside the **Community Development** Team, formulated a survey on ArcGIS Survey123, a software program from ESRI.









## **Planning**


- To facilitate an outdoor count the City of Perth's boundaries were divided into seventeen zones.
- These zones were determined by information provided by our Operations and Community Safety Alliances.
- Each zone factored in walkability and safety considerations and as such, seven zones were delegated to be counted in vehicles.






### **Volunteer Recruitment**

- For safety reasons minimum of 3 people in a group.
- 17 zones x 3 people = 51 people needed at a minimum.
- Combination of internal and external volunteers.







# Additional local government participation

- The City of Perth invited other local governments to participate in a count on the same date to secure wider data across Local Governments with homeless communities.
- Proximity to train lines was also considered with the invitations to these local governments.

## By Name List / Project Zero

- The daily observations, the Rough Sleeper Count and the 'By Name List' provide really clear data and demonstration of service need.
- Used in the Project Zero, the 'By Name List' records up-to-date information about the number of people experiencing homelessness in the community and tracks their movement in and out of homelessness.
- The approach aims to achieve 'functional zero' for rough sleeping in a city or town area using a combination of quality real-time data and service coordination.
- Through up-to-date data, bottlenecks in the system can be identified, and shared collaboration can be used to address these.
