4.1 MATTERS FOR DECISION

Items 5.1 and 5.4 were extracted for discussion.

5.1 Local Government Act Review

WALGA Recommendation

That WALGA:

- 1. Support the policy positions announced by the Minister for Local Government relating to phase 1 of the Local Government Act review process in relation to:
 - a. Acceptance and declaration of gifts;
 - b. Universal training;
 - c. Standards of behaviour;
 - d. CEO Recruitment and Performance:
 - e. Public notices and access to information; and,
 - f. Administrative efficiencies.

- 2. Seek a formal commitment from the Minister for Local Government that WALGA and Local Government Professionals WA now actively participate in the legislative drafting process to develop the Local Government Amendment Bill relating to Phase 1 of the Review;
- 3. Note the process for phase 2 of the Act review process and encourage Local Governments and Zones to provide input; and,
- 4. Acknowledge the timely progress of the Local Government Act Review and the Minister for Local Government's ongoing prioritisation of the Review within his portfolio of responsibilities.

5.2 Stop Puppy Farming – Local Government Consultation

WALGA Recommendation

That WALGA:

- 1. Welcomes a cost modelling review of the financial impact on Local Governments of any new legislation to Stop Puppy Farming;
- 2. Acknowledges the benefit of mandatory de-sexing of dogs not used for approved breeding purposes;
- 3. Supports a centralised dog registration system that is developed, operated and maintained by State Government:
- 4. Supports the introduction of compulsory registration of dog breeders;
- 5. Supports appropriate legislative exemptions for livestock working dogs in recognition of their special breeding requirements; and
- 6. Supports the transition of pet shops to adoption centres.

5.3 Interim Submission on Green Paper – Modernising WA's Planning System: Concepts for a Strategically Led System

WALGA Recommendation

That the interim submission to the Independent Planning Reform Team's Green Paper - Modernising WA's Planning System: Concepts for a strategically-led system, be endorsed.

5.4 Regional Health Services in Western Australia – Survey of Local Governments

WALGA Recommendation

That the recommendations of the WALGA Regional Health Services in Western Australian Survey of Local Governments be endorsed.

5.7 Vehicle Emissions

WALGA Recommendation

That WALGA:

- 1. Supports the consideration, where possible, of vehicle emissions during planning, designing and construction of large scale infrastructure projects.
- 2. Supports the consideration of vehicle emissions during the process of purchasing new fleet, in addition to fleet policies.
- 3. Supports the consideration of policies that facilitate the adoption of electric vehicles and electric vehicle charging infrastructure.
- 4. Advocates to the proposed Infrastructure Western Australia body, when it is established by the State Government, to consider vehicle emissions as part of the assessment process and cost-benefit analysis for projects.
- 5. Advocates to Infrastructure Australia to consider vehicle emissions such as particulate matter, other than greenhouse gas emissions, during the assessment of projects.
- 6. Advocates to State Government for the broader implementation of the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation 'CleanRun' roadside emissions monitoring program, as a behaviour change initiative which has the potential to reduce fuel consumption.

5. ZONE BUSINESS

5.1 Local Government Act Review – Phase 2

As per the WALGA State Council agenda (Item 5.1), the consultation process for Phase 2 of the *Local Government Act 1995* review has been announced by the Minister for Local Government.

The following key topics have been identified by the Government for consideration:

- 1. Role of Local Government
- 2. Community Engagement
- 3. Integrated Planning and Reporting
- 4. Elections
- 5. Financial Management (including procurement)
- 6. Rating
- 7. Beneficial Enterprises (Council Controlled Organisations)
- 8. Council Meetings
- 9. Complaints Management
- 10. Local Laws
- 11. Administrative Efficiencies

WALGA is seeking to finalise Local Government sector positions relating to Phase 2 (including any other issues) at the December 2019 State Council meeting.

The State Government is aiming to finalise consultation on Phase 2 of the Act this year to enable an Exposure Bill to be released in mid-2019.

State Council endorse a range of policy positions relating to items addressed in both Phase 1 and Phase 2 of the *Local Government Act 1995* Review at the December 2017 State Council meeting. Some additional topics have been raised by Zone members for consideration by the Zone.

Rating of State Government Agencies

Issue of Government agencies, Government trading entities not paying rates to Local Government, which can significantly erode the rate base of Local Governments.

WALGA's Policy Position:

Rating Exemptions - Rate Equivalency Payments

Legislation should be amended so rate equivalency payments made by LandCorp and other Government Trading Entities are made to the relevant Local Governments instead of the State Government.

WALGA's current policy position extends to seeking rate equivalency payments made by LandCorp and other Government Trading Entities, such as the Water Corporation and Horizon Power being made to the relevant Local Government instead of the State, however WALGA's policy position does not include rating of Government Departments such as DPAW.

Section 3.50 - Thoroughfares

Issues associated with penalties for driving on closed roads. The maximum penalty is defined under local laws, not by the Act.

WALGA does not have a policy position on this issue.

Section 3.27 and Schedule 3.2 - Taking Material to Repair a Thoroughfare

Issues associated with Local Government access to material.

WALGA does not have a policy position on this issue.

Beneficial Enterprises (Council Controlled Organisations)

Support for the introduction of Council Controlled Organisations (beneficial enterprises) that are not onerous to establish and administer given the fact that regulations already exists to manage corporations in this space.

Rates and grants cannot be the predominate source of revenue if LG are to be sustainable and in the case of market failure LG should be able to be proactive and respond to the needs of its community so that it remains viable and prosperous.

WALGA's Policy Position

The Local Government Act 1995 should be amended to enable Local Governments to establish Council Controlled Organisations (CCO).

Financial Management and Integrated Planning and Reporting Requirements

Financial Management and Reporting requirements and Integrated Planning and Reporting requirements be reviewed taking into consideration the cost and complexity for Band 3 and 4 Councils.

Resources are scarce and the cost of compliance is prohibitive especially for rural and remote communities and the system should link to banding to reduce the cost and complexity.

WALGA's Policy Position

WALGA has endorsed a general principle that the compliance regime should be tailored to Local Governments based on size and scale.

In December 2017 State Council resolved as follows:

That State Council endorse the following general principles as being fundamental to its response to the review of the Local Government Act:

- a) Uphold the General Competence Principle currently embodied in the Local Government Act;
- b) Provide for a flexible, principles-based legislative framework; and
- c) Promote a size and scale compliance regime
