About WALGA

The Western Australian Local Government Association (WALGA) is an independent, member-based, not for profit organisation representing and supporting the WA Local Government sector. Our membership includes all 139 Local Governments in the State.

WALGA uses its influence, support and expertise to deliver better outcomes for WA Local Governments and their communities. We do this through effective advocacy to all levels of Government on behalf of our Local Government Members, and by the provision of expert advice, services and support.

Our vision is for agile and inclusive Local Governments enhancing community wellbeing and enabling economic prosperity.

Benefits of Associate Membership

Becoming an Associate Member of WALGA entitles your organisation to a standard membership package, which includes:

Please note, Associate Members are ineligible to vote at any meetings of the Association and are not entitled to receive political representation or advocacy.

Eligibility

Associate Membership is primarily available to:

1. Organisations constituted by Local Governments such as Regional Council, Voluntary Regional Councils and Alliances;

- 2. Not-for-profit organisations that can demonstrate a link or relationship with the Local Government sector; and
- 3. Government agencies, including Government Trading Entities.

Organisations that fall outside of the above categories are still welcome to apply. However, all applying organisations must demonstrate links with the WA Local Government sector for membership to be approved. Associate Membership is <u>not</u> available to commercial organisations.

Prospective organisations are invited to complete and submit an application form.

Becoming an Associate Member

Upon acceptance of an organisation's application for Associate Membership and payment of the membership fee, your membership is continuous until such time as written intent to resign the membership is received by WALGA. Additional subscriptions fees will apply if an Associate Member chooses to access any of the additional, fee-for-service professional services as described above.

An applicant for Associate Membership must agree to be bound by the <u>Association Constitution</u> and to comply with the rules and regulations of WALGA as determined from time to time.

Associate Membership fees for FY2024/25

Membership and subscription fees are charged annually for each financial year. A new Associate Member may have their annual membership fee reduced on a pro rata basis, at the discretion of WALGA.
