

Training and Education

- So far in 2024, the PSHB Response team has delivered more than 80 presentations to LG staff, communities, industry and other key stakeholders.
- Stalls at various public events, including:
 - Perth Garden Festival
 - Hyde Park Festival
 - Kalamunda Garden Festival
- Interactive display for the upcoming 8-day Perth Royal Show



Training and Education

- Training for LG staff has been a key focus
- Equipping officers with the knowledge to detect and report possible PSHB infestation while undertaking regular duties → increased surveillance and early detections
- Offer for in-person training extended to 32 LGs within and adjacent to QA

Check restrictions before moving wood or plant material:

• Wood must be chipped to less than 2.5 cm before leaving the Quarantine Area.

Local Government Engagement Plan


- Aims for further collaboration between DPIRD and LGs to eradicate PSHB
- Informed by consultation with LG representatives and WALGA
- Suite of actions for implementation by DPIRD and suggestions for LGs
- Letter issued to CEOs
 - Nominate a representative to engage with the PSHB response

Commitments of the plan include:

- LG reporting channel in the MyPestGuide® Reporter App.
- Tailored monthly bulletin to LGs
- Monthly meetings with LGs to discuss priority tree
 management and surveillance activities
- PSHB maps with the locations of positive traps and infested premises within LGA (for those that have entered into a privacy Deed Poll).

Quarantine Area (QA)


- Detections outside of the QA triggered a review of the boundaries
- QA expanded, 5 new LGs:
 - Armadale, Kwinana, Mundaring, Rockingham and Serpentine Jarrahdale
- QA split into 2 zones:
 - Zone A (inner metro, high infestations)
 - Zone B (outer metro, buffer zone)
- Letters issued to CEOs



Quarantine Area (QA): Zone A

Zone A includes areas of 'higher infestation'


- cannot move untreated or unseasoned wood outside Zone A, unless chipped to pieces that are 2.5 cm or less in diameter;
- cannot move plant materials, including living plants, that are greater than 2cm in diameter outside Zone A;
- must ensure any machinery used to handle wood or plant material is cleaned before it can be moved outside **Zone A**.
- can move wood or plant materials, including living plants, within Zone A



Quarantine Area (QA): Zone B

Zone B acts as a 'buffer zone' with fewer or no infested trees.

- cannot move untreated or unseasoned wood outside the Quarantine Area, unless chipped to pieces that are 2.5 cm or less in diameter;
- cannot move plant materials, including living plants, that are greater than 2cm in diameter outside the Quarantine Area;
- must ensure any machinery used to handle wood or plant material is cleaned before it can be moved outside the Quarantine Area;
- can move wood or plant materials, including living plants, within Zone B and into Zone A.
