City of Albany	\$100,00
Albany Tourism and Information Hub	
<p>This is a larger project to relocate and enhance the Albany Visitors Centre to co-locate with the existing Albany Public Library. The project will extend the existing building facade to facilitate creation of a state-of-the-art tourist information hub as part of a staged approach to reactivate the Albany CBD to stimulate economic growth and attract and retain residents, businesses and visitors to the region.</p>

Shire of Broome	\$74,000
Changing Places at Broome Recreation and Aquatic Centre	
<p>The Shire of Broome sought funding to enable the construction of a Changing Places facility at the Broome Recreation and Aquatic Centre. This location will allow the facility to be easily accessed by both users of the pool area and the stadium, sports courts and multipurpose room as well as the general public. In line with funding requirements users will not be charged to use the Changing Place facility.</p>

City of Cockburn	\$100,000
Regional Playground Changing Places Project	
<p>The City of Cockburn requested funding towards :</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • a height adjustable adult sized changing bench • a tracking hoist system, and • increasing the floor size of the planned toilet block facility to accommodate the changing bench and hoist system. <p>The City already has plans and funds allocated to build a new accessible toilet block at the Regional Playground site in Bibra Lake.</p>

City of Greater Geraldton	\$100,000
Adult Changing Place facility	
<p>City of Greater Geraldton sought funding to construct an adult Changing Place that will be part of the City's Foreshore funded through a Development program. The facility will have beach wheelchair storage and accessible change rooms. The existing block is to be gutted with only the main shell and roof remaining. The proposed works will bring the toilet block and restricted mobility access facility in line with best practice and Australian Standards.</p>

City of Mandurah	\$100,000
Changing Places Mandurah	
<p>The City of Mandurah sought funding for the construction of a Changing Places within the City of Mandurah. Providing Changing Places facilities will make Mandurah a premium accessible destination. This facility, strategically located, will ensure that visitors with complex or high needs, carers and families have the amenities to support a day trip or holiday to the City. Furthermore, for the residents of Mandurah it will mean the freedom of choice to enjoy recreational activities.</p>

Town of Narrogin	\$66,000
Narrogin Changing Places Project	
<p>The Town of Narrogin sought funding to construct a Changing Place Disability Toilet at Gnarojin Park. The project will have the following benefits:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • a more inclusive and accessible region • a greater sharing of public open space in the region • an increase in the number of visitors enjoying retail, leisure and social activities • a healthier, more active and diverse community life • a more dignified life for carers and people with disability residing in the region • a more age friendly region

Toodyay Duke Street Changing Places Facility	
<p>The Shire of Toodyay sought funding for the construction and equipping of a Changing Place at the Shire Memorial Swimming Pool. Toodyay is very much a tourism/events area with regular visitors and residents that will benefit from this project. A Changing Place, when added to the already planned refurbishment of the existing building would greatly enhance the services on offer to visitors and residents and make Toodyay more inclusive.</p>
