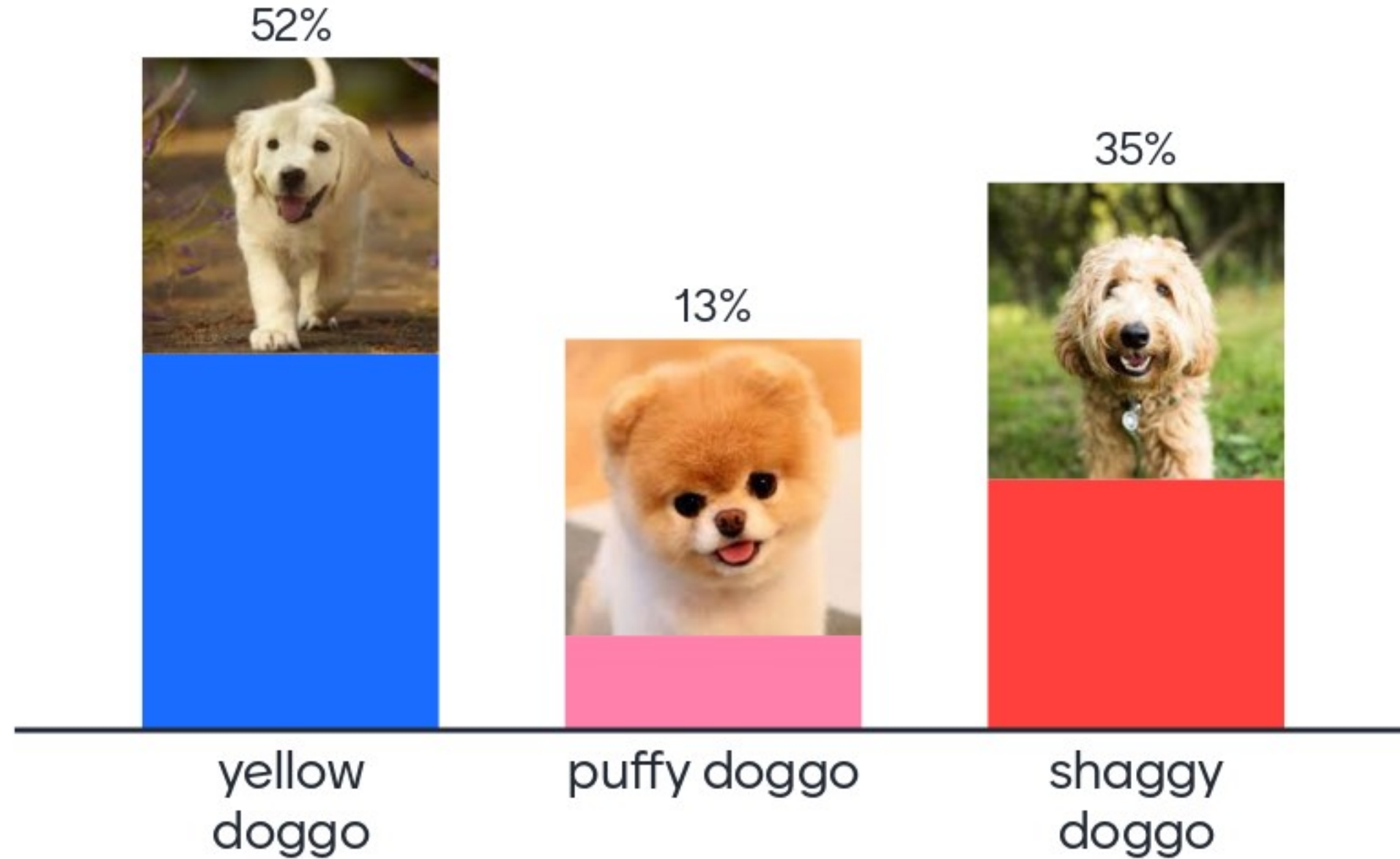


# Local Government Responses to COVID-19

The COVID19 Pandemic has had significant social and economic impacts on communities across Western Australia. Local Governments have made adjustments to their operations across the board, including their responses to crime and community safety. 26% of respondents to the Markyt Community Resilience Scorecard research undertaken in mid 2020 rated community safety and crime prevention as the main recovery priority for Local Government.

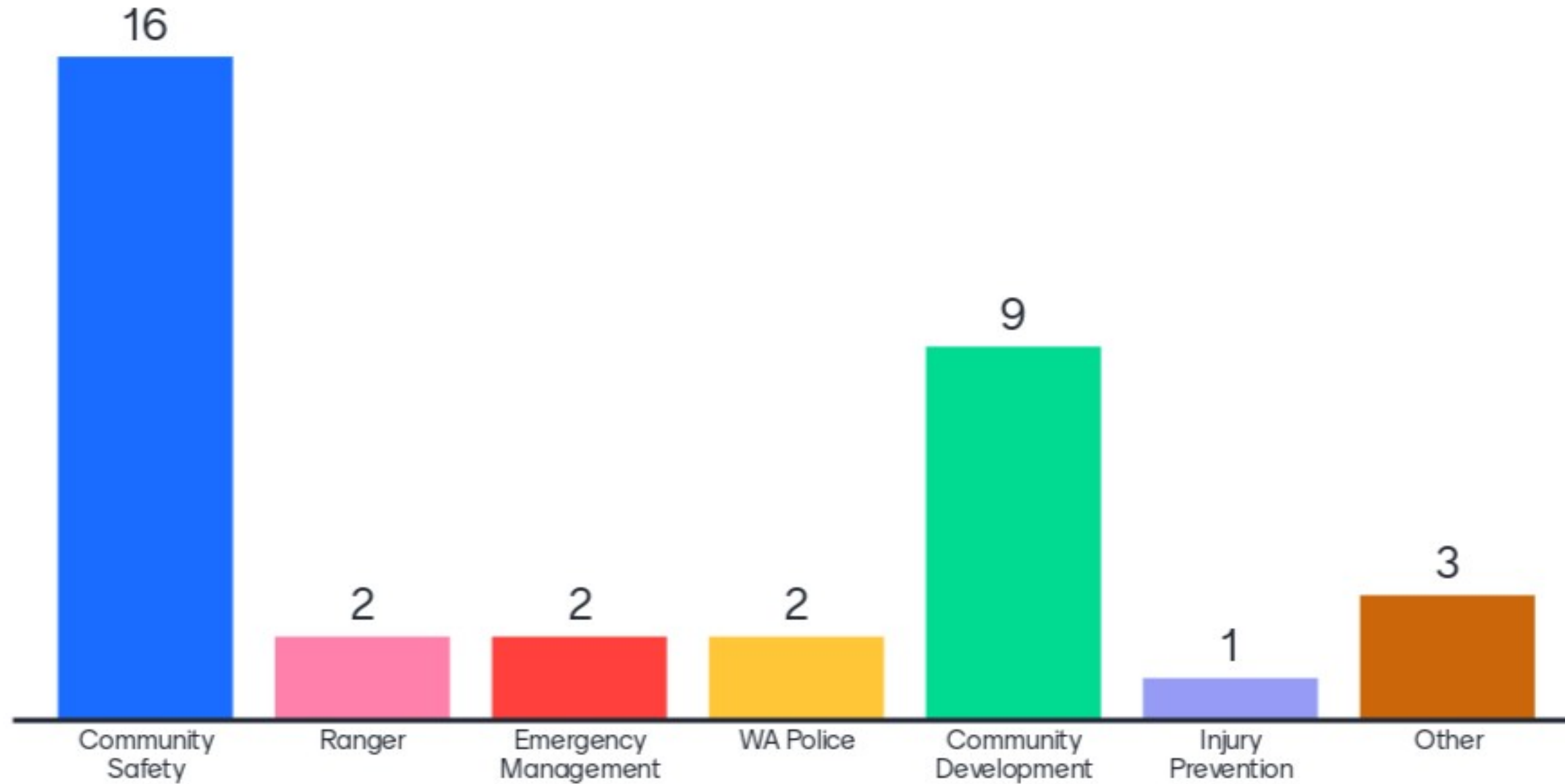

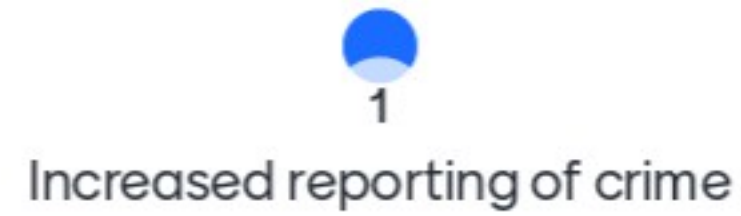
Less people out in public spaces - more homeless people visible

Higher alcohol-use within the community

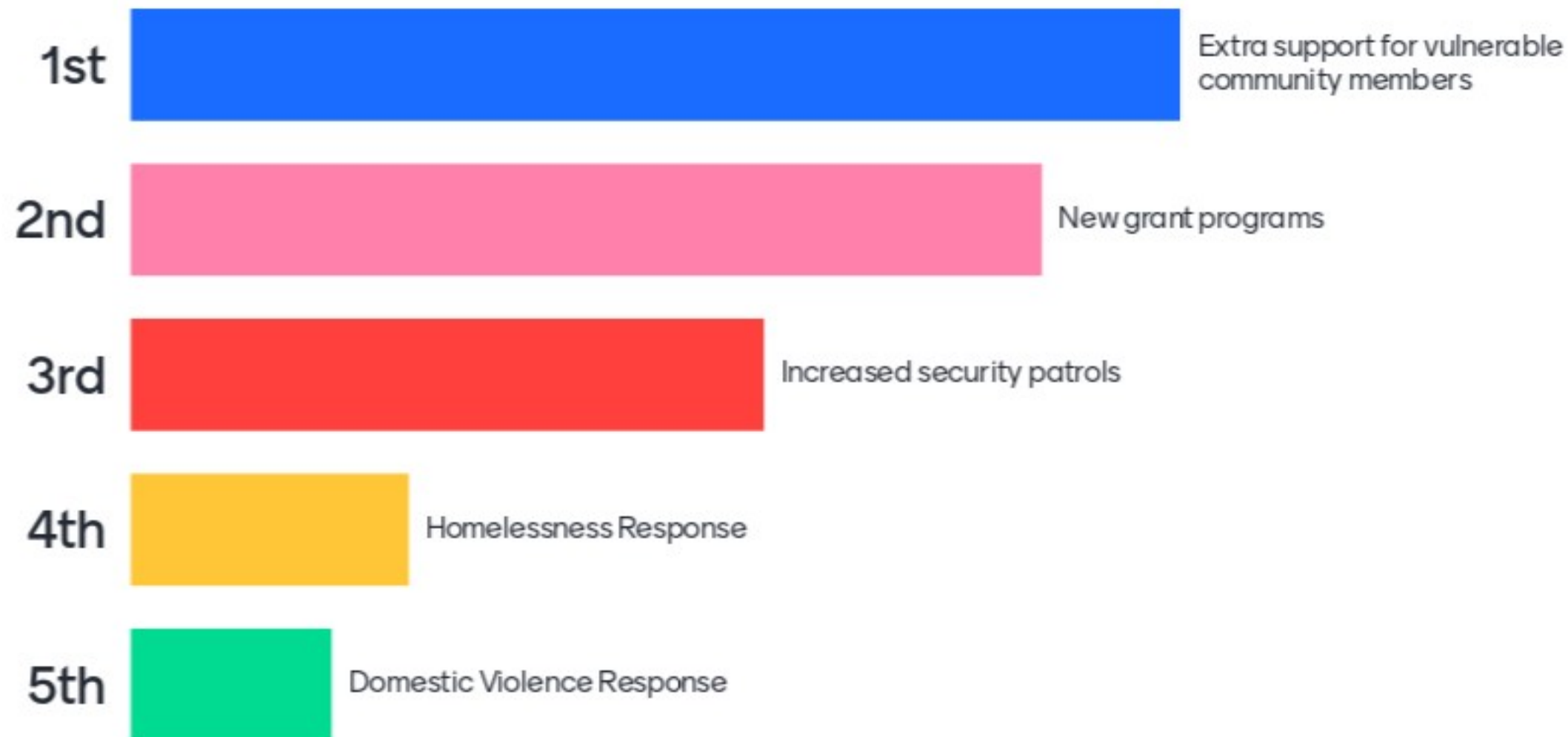
Reported increase DFV within emergency services, but not reflected within WAPOL stats
