
Established in 1989

Mission is to ensure all rural communities in Western Australia have access to high quality health care




SERVICE AREAS


RURAL WORKFORCE STATUS

General practice in rural WA


- 934 GPs including GP Registrars*

- 210 general practices*


Health professional vacancies

VISAS FOR GPs INITIATIVE


Employer sponsored visas

- Temporary Skill Shortage (TSS, subclass 482) visa
- Employer Nomination Scheme (ENS, subclass 186) visa
- Regional Sponsored Migration Scheme (RSMS, subclass 187) visa

The Visas for GPs initiative will reduce the number of International Medical Graduates entering the primary healthcare workforce by 200 doctors per year.

Target occupations;

- General Medical Practitioner
- Resident Medical Officer
- Medical Practitioner not elsewhere classified
