

Bushfire Training for Local Governments

DFES Rural Fire Awareness

The DFES Rural Fire Awareness course is targeted at farmer response brigades and seasonal workers and provides students with a basic awareness of fireground safety, suppression strategies and maintaining their safety when operating on a fireground.

Bushfire Fundamentals

Bushfire Fundamentals has been developed to support those who undertake duties in supporting Incident Management Teams. This course can be offered to external agencies who undertake a role within the Incident Support Group. This product covers basics in AIIMS, IMT functions, basic fireground safety but excludes suppression techniques.

Becoming a DFES training assessor

Across WA many volunteer brigade members and Local Government officers are qualified as DFES trainer assessors and deliver training locally.

In terms of the process for becoming a DFES trainer assessor, any applications are submitted through the relevant DFES region and the requirements include:

- Holding the competency, the trainer is seeking endorsement in (for example Bushfire Safety Awareness)
- Holding a relevant training qualification, which is:
 - o DFES0612 Workplace Trainer Assessor OR
 - TAE40116 Certificate IV in Training and Assessment OR
 - TAE40110 Certificate IV in Training and Assessment AND TAEASS502A/TAEASS502B/TAEASS502 Design and develop assessment tools AND TAELLN401A/TAELLN411 Address adult language, literacy and numeracy skills
- Brigade, group or unit (BGU) support and endorsement of the application
- Regional endorsement of the application (CESM/AO/DO or similar)

Trainer assessor endorsement is open to anyone who meets the above criteria and has the support of their BGU/Local Government, and the DFES Region.
