


Who we are

There is a collaborative, effective and consistent approach to coastal and estuarine management







Opportunities from a Sydney Harbour CMP

- Potential to establish a clear governance framework for managing Greater Sydney Harbour
- Opportunity to develop a strategic and integrated longterm plan for Sydney Harbour (for the first time), that can address system-wide threats and drive parallel planning processes / strategies
- Provides a vehicle to secure significant funding for planning and action
- Provides statutory immunity for Councils


